

Henry M. Boehm and Staten Island

Henry Boehm was assigned to the Staten Island area in 1835. He and his wife Sarah Hill Boehm are buried at the Woodrow United Methodist Church, Staten Island, NY. Their son, Henry Martin Boehm became an educator near Richmond, Staten Island. He became the Richmond County School Commissioner overseeing 24 schools. The house in which he taught is still standing and has been relocated to "Historic Richmond Town", a recreated historic village open to tourists on Staten Island.

PS 55 Staten Island, or Henry M. Boehm School is named in his honor. They have approximately 750 students, Pre-K thru 5th grade.

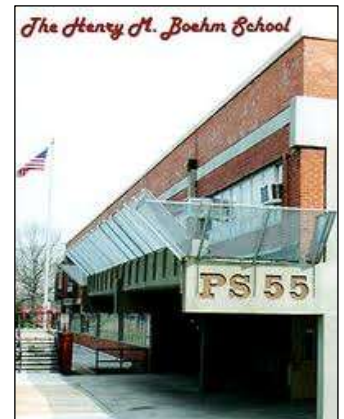
